DOUGLAS COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH REORGANIZES SERVICES

In light of continued budget reductions, Douglas County Public Health is scaling back and reorganizing some of its clinic services. The following changes become effective on January 1, 2010.

New Immunization Clinic Hours at Health Department, Roseburg Office

New Hours

Monday – Friday, 1:00 PM – 4:30 PM

Services Available

Child and Adult Immunizations provided on a walk-in basis
TB Skin Testing available if the client is able to return in 48-72 hours for a reading

Communicable Disease Program Changes

Head Lice, Scabies, and Rashes: The Health Department will no longer see people on a walk-in basis or by appointment for head lice, scabies, or rashes. People should seek medical care through their health care provider, a local or regional health clinic, or talk with a pharmacist about effective over-the-counter medications.

The Health Department's Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Clinic will continue to assess and recommend treatment for lice and rashes as part of its standard STD clinical assessment for sexually active persons.
