

# HALF MOON BAY CAMPGROUND

Half Moon Bay Campground, located off to Highway 101 in Winchester Bay just four miles south of Reedsport offers non hook-up camping facilities for RV'S, pickup campers and tents. Situated in the heart of recreational activity on Douglas County's coast line, Half Moon Bay Campground is a great place to stay and enjoy such activities as sport fishing, OHV riding in the Dunes NRA area, tours of the Umpqua River Lighthouse and Coastal Visitor Center or just a quiet walk on the beautiful beaches.

Half Moon Bay campground has (45) individual non hook-up RV campsites; 13 of which are reservable. Campsites: \$20.00 per night. A \$2.00 discount applies to Douglas County residents. Five Group Camping sites are available for reservation. Prices for Group Sites are: Group (A) \$60.00; Group (B) \$60.00; Group (C) \$75.00; Group (D) \$60.00 and Group (E) \$75.00 per night. Reservations may be made from eleven months to two weeks prior to the arrival date. A \$10.00 non-refundable reservation fee applies to all reservations. Cancellation Policy for Individual Sites: 1 week prior to arrival date. Cancellation Policy for Group Sites: 1 month prior to arrival date. To make a reservation, please contact the Park office at 541-957-7001 between 10:00 am and 2:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

**Our camp rules are:** Physical presence is required to register for a campsite. By physical presence we mean the person who is to occupy the site must be present, with his or her camping unit, ready to physically occupy the site.

**CAMPSITE:** A physical site consisting of parking space for one camping unit and one tow vehicle. A camping unit is defined as any unit that is used for sleeping such as a motor home, 5<sup>th</sup> wheel, tent, car, van or a pickup with canopy or camper. A tow vehicle is either the vehicle being towed or the vehicle towing the camping unit. Any other vehicles are to be considered extra vehicles. A small tent is allowed to accompany the primary camping unit in the campsite. A small tent is defined as a tent designed to be occupied by two or three persons. Any larger tents must be placed in another site and pay the appropriate fee. In campgrounds with large campsites that can accommodate multiple camping units, more than one camping unit will be allowed only by permission of the Camp Host and must pay the appropriate fee for another campsite.

**Check out** time is 1:30 pm. If you plan to stay another night, please deposit campsite fee at the Pay Station.

- \* Fires are allowed in designated areas only. Camp stoves may be used in established campsites. Firewood must be kept in a neatly stacked pile. Do not leave a fire or portable stove unattended.
- \* As the park is a game sanctuary, discharging of firearms is prohibited.
- \* Cutting of vegetation for burning is prohibited.
- \* **BE GOOD NEIGHBORS** and keep your camp neat, clean and orderly. Deposit trash in the containers provided and leave your campsite as clean as you found it.
- \* All **pets** must be kept on a leash. Please do not permit your animal to run wild, molest other park users, or the wildlife. Please clean up after your pet.

**QUIET TIME** will be considered from 10:00 pm until 7:00 am in the morning. During this time please be considerate of your neighbors. Please keep your pets quiet, do not run generators, play music, drive OHV's or engage in loud behavior.

All vehicles, including trail bicycles and OHV's will travel and park within the designated roads and parking areas and will maintain a speed limit of 10 miles per hour or less.

**Camper stay limits:** From May 15 to September 15, ten days out of every fourteen.  
From September 16 to May 14, fourteen days out of every eighteen.

You are invited to visit the numerous other park areas maintained for your pleasure throughout the county.
