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The cor. of secs. 8 & 9 on the N. bdy. of sec. 17, monumented by Mensch, in 1921, with an iron post, 2" dia., 8" above ground, firmly set, but rusted through to the concrete core, with brass cap marked

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Found - 1954 GLO brass cap (1953-54 cadastral survey)  
18" fir windfall, rotten hull w/scribing bears N.63°E., 12.1 to blaze. (6" N.60°E., 10.6 ft.) root hole matches orig. calls)

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TOWNSHIP 20 RANGE 09 POINT IDENTIFIER # 278500

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36" fir windfall w/healed blaze bears N.6°E., 18.0 ft. to blaze. (36" N.25°W., 23.8 ft.)  
18" maple w/BT tag bears S.44¼°E., 13.1 ft. tag, S.59°E., 14.9 ft.  
New BTs- 43" fir, "T20S R9W S8 BT" N.25¼°W., 51.3 ft.  
34" fir, "T20S R9W S9 BT" N.70½°E., 42.6 ft.  
We raised a stone mound around the monument.
