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Set a Fir post, 5 ft. long, 5 ins. dia., 20" in ground for the ¼ sec. cor. between secs. 14 & 15, from which  
A Fir, 8" dia., bears S.5°E., 84 lks.  
A Fir, 8" dia., bears S.2°W., 109 lks.

GLO resurvey and retracement by Levi C. Walker under contract #763, dated Aug. 23, 1905 - (DCSO records Vol. 7 Page(s) 2753)

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I make diligent search for the ¼ cor. but can find no trace of it.  
Set a Fir post 3 ft. long, 4" sq., 24" in the ground, from ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ S on W & 14 on E face, from which  
A Fir, 12" dia., bears S.77°E., 23 lks., mkd: ¼ S14 BT.  
A Fir, 10" dia., bears N.80°W., 44 lks., mkd: ¼ S BT.

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Found - Orig. post, now missing from which a:  
8" Fir bears S.5°E., 84 lks., now missing.  
8" Fir bears S.2°W., 109 lks., now missing.  
Retracement by Levi C. Walker, June 1905  
Post now missing, from which a  
12" Fir bears S.77°E., 23 lks., now 31", face exposed by unknown party, face rotted, orig. axe work visible.  
10" Fir bears N.80°W., 44 lks., now 27"x6' stub, face exposed by unknown party, orig. axe work visible on small portion of face on down log, most of face destroyed when tree blew down.  
Summit of divide, South 37 lks., now in place.  
Set - 1½"x36" galv. IP with 3" bronze cap mkd: "Ore. St. Bd. of Forestry ¼ S14 1959 RS359", 33" in ground in mound of stone, and from which a:  
30" Fir bears S.60°E., 36.9 ft., scribed ¼ S14 359.  
20" Fir bears N.57½°E., 50.1 ft., scribed ¼ S BT  
Oregon T. Bd. of Forestry metal location poster on  
16" Fir S.88°W., 40.2 ft.

- 12" Fir (1906) S.77°E., 23 lks., now windfall downhill, face exposed & badly decayed, no scribes visible.
  - 10" Fir (1906) N.80°W., 44 lks., now 23"x 5' high rotten stub in place exposed, no scribes visible.
- Summit of divided South 37 lks.
- 30" Fir (1959) S.60°E., 36.9 ft., now 45" x 2' high stump face closed.
  - 20" Fir (1959) N.57½°E. 50.1 ft, now 28" face closed
  - 16" Fir (1959) S.88°W., 40.2 ft., yellow metal location poster only, now 16"x3' high rotten stub, yellow metal location poster fallen off.
- White painted cedar post NW 1.5 ft. now rotten and fallen over.
- Set - 16" Fir S.56°E., 32.4 ft., to aluminum nail in BT face scribed: ¼S14BT. Bearing tree tag.
